Seafarers' work: Recognising hazards and harms

Each seafarer has to fill in this questionnaire **himself/herself**. The objective is to detect defects related to safety at work and occupational health care, so that appropriate measures can be taken to remove these defects. The goal is to evaluate your working conditions and work because you are the one who knows them best.

Think about each question from your own perspective and circle the most suitable alternative(s). While answering the questions, think about situations that somehow differ from your normal duties, such as situations related to maintenance, repairing, cleaning, purification, conflicts and defects. Describe in the relevant question the defect or problem, as well as where or in what kind of situation it occurs. If you need more space, please continue your answer on the last page of the questionnaire. It is important that you describe the defect and the problematic situation clearly enough, so that appropriate measures can be taken. If you have any concrete suggestions, please make sure to write them down as well.

After you have filled in the questionnaire, return it to your occupational health care unit. The occupational health care will compile a ship/department specific summary. The summary will then be dealt with in the safety committee, which will initiate any necessary further action.
